

Shadow Canyon (York Mountain, Paso Robles)

RIISE's first major acquisition, Shadow Canyon sits high on York Mountain at nearly 1,800 feet of elevation. With steep slopes and coastal influence, it delivers fruit marked by freshness, structure, and mineral lift. This site has become the "anchor" of the RIISE portfolio, offering intensity and terroir-driven distinction.

Arbor Ranch (Willow Creek District, Paso Robles)

Arbor Ranch spans 22 acres with 16 under vine in the heart of Willow Creek. This property is central to the future of RIISE, serving as the planned home of its winery, tasting room, and production facility. The site provides a riper, more supple counterpoint to the higher-elevation fruit from York Mountain.

Heaton Ranch (Willow Creek, Paso Robles)

The 85-acre Heaton Ranch sees nearly 50 acres of which are planted. Known for its diverse mix of limestone, calcareous, and alluvial soils, Heaton adds remarkable texture and complexity to the estate portfolio. Farmed with an emphasis on sustainability and respect for the land, it has quickly become a cornerstone of RIISE's vineyard holdings.



Vineyards & Partnerships

These grower partnerships allow RIISE to craft layered, expressive wines that highlight Paso Robles' range of terroirs, while the estate vineyards provide the foundation for long-term identity and prestige.

- <u>Paderewski Vineyard</u> Known for old-vine Graciano and Tempranillo, often featured in RIISE's blends.
- <u>Full Draw, ONX, Catapult, Four Hearts</u> Distinguished Willow Creek vineyards that contribute Rhône varieties, adding depth and nuance.
- <u>Templeton Gap</u> Cooler parcels supplying unique blending elements that bring freshness and aromatic lift.

2021 Tasting Notes

From Shadow Canyon's limestone-kissed slopes to Heaton and Arbor's chalky hillsides, the vineyards lent their character. Altitude sharpened the acids; soil imparted chalk and spice. The vines spoke in layered texture.

Pouring deep ruby, Jovian opens with black cherry and graphite, then slides into cedar, dried herbs, a touch of saddle leather. Tannins are firm yet polished; the finish carries a lingering mineral hum. This is Paso elegance in muscular dress, with the critical accalim to follow suit.



2021 Tasting Notes

From the calcareous, low-vigor soils of Arbor and Heaton, the grapes rise with clarity. These grounds demand focus; the vines respond with purity and backbone. Minimal vigor, maximum voice.

In the glass, Doyen is red and black berries underlaid by basalt spice, dried rose, crushed pepper. Silk and sinew entwined. The mid-palate holds you; the finish exhales graphite dust. A Grenache-led symphony with supporting cast



2021 Tasting Notes

Shadow Canyon's windswept slopes, Arbor's chalk banks, Heaton's shale ridges: each plot carved its fingerprint. The result is perfume riding on tension, strength smoothed by mineral undergrowth.

In the glass, Peace begins with black plum, violet, smoke and graphite. Then whispers of sage, white pepper, game. Dense, muscular, yet graceful. It's a wine you lean into, then lean back, and it holds you.
